

English

Literacy work based on class text – The Giant’s Necklace by Michael Morpurgo and Holes, by Louis Sachar.

Children will be writing for a range of genres, including diary entries, descriptions, newspaper reports, informal letters and poetry. Children will use a range of grammar, punctuation, rich vocabulary and skills of editing and improving over the course of the term.

Science

Evolution and inheritance – how living things have changed over time; the concept that characteristics are passed from parent to offspring; variations over time can make animals adapt.

Light – how light travels and enables us to see things; how shadows are produced and how light is reflected; using scientific skills to raise and answer questions

Computing

We are publishers – creating a yearbook or magazine.

We are connected – developing skills for social media.

Art/ D&T

Explore the artist Banksy and create environmental artwork linked to our topic.

Pupils will use recycled materials to design and create substantial clothing, evaluating their final products.

Geography

Pupils will explore how the world has changed; the geographical and physical changes. Pupils will look at costal erosion, weathering, mountains and rivers.

They will also research the effects of pollution on the world and climate change.

History

Pupils will explore the effects on the environment.

Lessons will give opportunities for pupils to gain knowledge about the changes in personal and global environment and how it affects us.

Pupils will research the effects of the ‘personal’ environment – such as education, peers, etc.
