

As a school we incorporate a Sport Plus coach to teach one lesson a week for each year group of PE. In addition to this they lead afterschool clubs and dinner time games. They bring in a breadth of skills and knowledge of all sports.

The sports children learn in PE are continue in each year group. More detail and skills are added each year, by the end of Year 6 they will play a sport competitively.

After school multisport clubs take place weekly for every year group from Year 1 to 6.

Staff break down gender stereotypes during lessons and courage children to compete/take part in sports they love and enjoy.

Each class takes part in the mile a day, the class that has walked the furthest amount of miles wins a trophy for a week.

Weekly sports news is displayed on the PE display board in the centre of school. The news covers all sports and achievements. The display includes the current sports for the term, ambassadors and children's work.

Inter house competitions take place each half term/term after a sport is taught.

We listen to the children's voices of what sports and games they would like to see more of in PE and during playtime.

Whole school Sports Day takes place at the end of the year where children compete in their year groups and houses to win the House cup.

Quality PE examples are demonstrated in school. When teaching a sport staff encourage children to see anybody can compete in a sport by showing professional sports people competing.

Sports workshops with out of school agencies take place. The children can work with them based on their speciality such as Dance or Judo.

PE ambassadors are appointed from Year 1 to 6. They undertake duties for the subject and promote different sports and playground games.
