

English

The children will explore a range of fairy tales with a twist and look at the important components that we might find in a classic fairy tale.

Don't pick your nose Pinocchio - This book looks at personal hygiene and the importance of listening to instructions. Children will retell the narrative using pictures to correctly sequence the story, they will focus on including a range of vocabulary from the book. Children will then also look at the importance of personal hygiene and create a set of instructions to help maintain this.

Stinky Jack and the Beanstalk - This story also follows the theme of personal hygiene and why it is important to stay clean and is similar to the fairy tale they may already know with a twist. The children will produce a range of writing during this topic including a character description, a setting description and poetry.

History

We are looking at key events that have happened in our past focusing on the Great Fire of London. These events give the children a glimpse into the past and they will look at the disasters from the eyes of those who have lived through it.

The Great Fire of London - explore when, where, why and how it happened. The children will see what it was like from the eyes of Samuel Pepys. Children will write a diary entrance as Samuel Pepys and will design a box they would bury from the fire.
