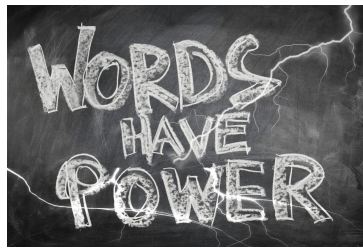


One School, One Community

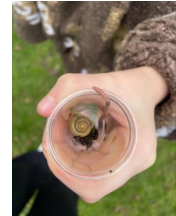
